

Summer 2021 Enrichment with Miss Nauta

All courses are open to SVMS students entering grades 4-6 and will be held in my classroom from 9:00-11:00. Maximum class size is 15 students, first come, first serve. Please make checks payable to SVMS. Students must be registered before classes begin (preferably by the last day of school, June 15.) Payment is due at the time of registration. No refunds will be given.

1. Week of June 21 - June 25: Book Club - *Snow Treasure* by Marie McSwigan

- Set in Norway, Peter Lundstrom never thought he would become a hero. But that bleak winter of 1940 was like no other. Nazi troops parachuted into Peter's tiny village. Nobody thought they could be defeated - until Uncle Victor told Peter how the children of the village could fool the enemy.
- Come prepared to read, write, & have lively discussions.
- *Materials Needed: a folder & pen/pencil; I will provide the novels and loose leaf paper*
- **Cost: \$300**

2. Week of June 28-July 2: Writing to Texts

- One of the most important aspects of the Common Core Standards is writing to texts, or sources. What does this mean? Writing to texts requires students to analyze, clarify, and cite information they read in the text.
- We will work on various types of writing: opinion/argumentative, informative/explanatory, narrative, and texts with prompts.
- *Materials Needed: folder & pencil(s); I will provide the loose leaf paper*
- **Cost: \$300**

3. Week of July 5 - July 9: Book Club - *The Tale of Despereaux* by Kate DiCamillo

- What could bring together a tiny mouse with exceptionally long ears, a rat who longs for a world full of light, and a lonely serving girl with a simple, impossible wish? Readers, it is your destiny to find out.
- Come prepared to read, write, & have lively discussions.
- *Materials Needed: a folder & erasable pens/pencils; I will provide the novels and loose leaf paper*
- **Cost: \$300**

4. Week of July 12 - July 16: Nonfiction and Fiction Paired texts

- Making connections is an important part of everyday life. This course will help students gain important reading skills and practice responding to questions based on the Common Core Standards. We will practice making and understanding connections between content-rich reading materials; build reading comprehension skills; analyze, compare, and contrast fiction and nonfiction texts; sequencing and summarizing; practice with short-answer responses; quoting from texts; and develop written responses to various prompts.
- *Materials Needed: folder & pencil(s); I will provide the loose leaf paper*
- **Cost: \$300**
